

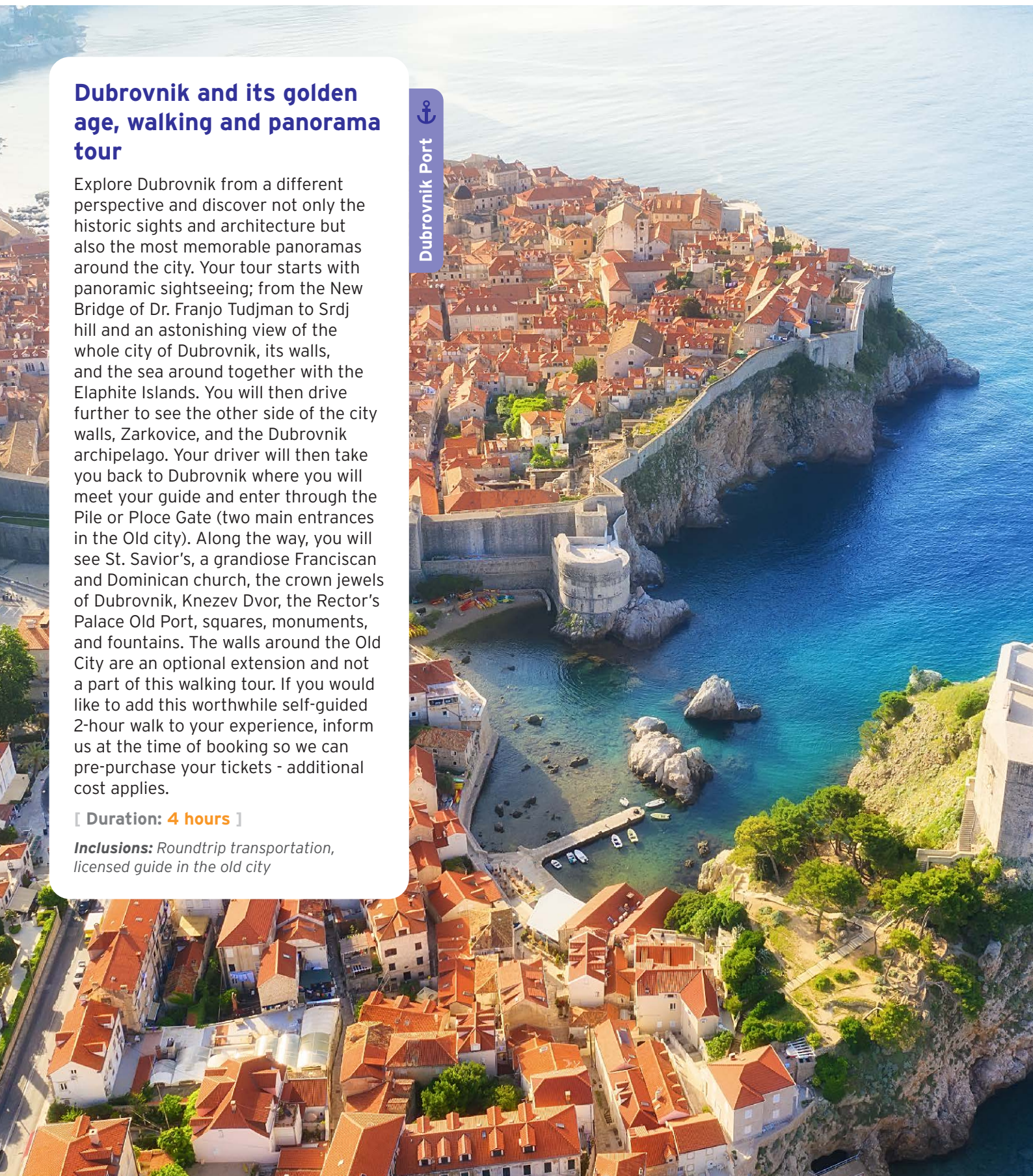
Dubrovnik and its golden age, walking and panorama tour

Explore Dubrovnik from a different perspective and discover not only the historic sights and architecture but also the most memorable panoramas around the city. Your tour starts with panoramic sightseeing; from the New Bridge of Dr. Franjo Tudjman to Srdj hill and an astonishing view of the whole city of Dubrovnik, its walls, and the sea around together with the Elaphite Islands. You will then drive further to see the other side of the city walls, Zarkovice, and the Dubrovnik archipelago. Your driver will then take you back to Dubrovnik where you will meet your guide and enter through the Pile or Ploce Gate (two main entrances in the Old city). Along the way, you will see St. Savior's, a grandiose Franciscan and Dominican church, the crown jewels of Dubrovnik, Knezev Dvor, the Rector's Palace Old Port, squares, monuments, and fountains. The walls around the Old City are an optional extension and not a part of this walking tour. If you would like to add this worthwhile self-guided 2-hour walk to your experience, inform us at the time of booking so we can pre-purchase your tickets - additional cost applies.

Visit the historic Pharmacy at the Franciscan Monastery, home to ancient remedies and unique artifacts. Conclude with breathtaking panoramic views from Mount Srdj, reached by cable car, offering a spectacular perspective of this timeless city.

Pula historic walking tour

Tour to Trogir

Trogir, a UNESCO World Heritage site, boasts stunning architecture, highlighted by St. Lawrence Cathedral and its majestic Radovan's Portal. Renowned European artists contributed to this masterpiece, showcasing Gothic and Renaissance brilliance. Walking through Trogir feels like stepping back to Grecian, Roman, and Venetian times, with nearly every home featuring crests or stylistic elements. Preserved palaces, 13th-century houses, and medieval churches dot the historic core, while remnants of stone walls and towers stand proudly along the city's southern edge.

Tour to Split, Salona and Trogir

Split grew out of a Roman emperor's palace. The palace still stands - people have lived there for over 17 centuries. Split is one of the living and breathing monuments both to how people lived in the past and to different styles and influences carved into its narrow streets, Roman temples, and Christian churches. Outside the palace, the story of Split continues as it spreads from its center, the palace, to beautiful vistas on the hill of Marjan, to the old town, waterfront (Riva), and its beaches. Salona is where it all started for this region, first an ancient Illyrian city, then the capital of the Roman province Dalmatia. Birthplace of Roman emperor Diocletian, who, after his career, decided to build a palace nearby as a summer home. Salona now lies in ruins, destroyed in the centuries that followed its glory years. However, the history and the vast area of the 6th city in the Roman Empire still make memories come to life for every traveler who visits it. Trogir is a small town founded by ancient Greek settlers in the 3rd century BC. For centuries, Trogir was where numerous artists left their mark, leaving an imprint inside the city's soul. From its famous St. Laurence Cathedral portal to the Venetian fortifications used to fight off the invaders, this small city truly packs a lot of history and art. Later, embark on a culinary journey through the heartland of Kaštelski Crljenak, the esteemed ancestor of Zinfandel, on the beautiful slopes of Kozjak Hill. This unique experience unfolds in a private vineyard surrounded by panoramic views, where tradition and flavor harmonize to highlight the essence of Dalmatian winemaking. Upon arrival, indulge in an exclusive food and wine pairing featuring 3 expertly curated courses, each crafted to complement the bold, full-bodied wines of the region. This tasting experience offers an authentic taste of local heritage, celebrating the rich flavors and stories of Croatia's famed wine country.

Food and history walking tour in Split

Embark on a 3-hour walking tour with an expert local guide who is a history buff and foodie. This tour includes generous food stops so you can taste the most delicious local specialties while you walk through the 1700-year-old imperial city, getting to know the Diocletian's Palace and the surrounding medieval highlights. You will start your food adventure on the very vibrant Greenmarket - the belly of Split - with traditional finger food from the Croatian hinterland - local cheese and prosciutto, peka bread, and soparnik - a local delicacy protected by the geographical origin on the territory of EU. As you make your way through the narrow streets within the famous Diocletian's Palace with your guide, you will make a few more stops to visit local artisanal shops to try their delicious products. Right after you rub the toe of the renowned Grgur Ninski statue for good luck, you will head to a great local restaurant in the heart of the old town for a light lunch where you will be able to savor local pasta or risotto with a glass of wine (red or white). The tour concludes with a visit to the oldest pastry shop in Split, where you will taste traditional sweets (bobici, mandulat) and homemade gelato, rounding off this perfect combination of the best and most important historical sites of Split and its culinary traditions.
