DAY 1 / Split

Touch down in Split and step into living history. Your private driver whisks you from Resnik Airport to your hotel, and the rest of the day is yours. Stroll stone alleys inside Diocletian's Palace, linger on the Riva with a seaside espresso, and watch the city glow at sunset. Ask your Travelive planner for a few local gems.

DAY 2 / Food and history walking tour in Split

Embark on a 3-hour walking tour with an expert local guide who is a history buff and foodie. This tour includes generous food stops so you can taste the most delicious local specialties while you walk through the 1700-year-old imperial city, getting to know the Diocletian's Palace and the surrounding medieval highlights. You will start your food adventure on the very vibrant Greenmarket - the belly of Split - with traditional finger food from the Croatian hinterland - local cheese and prosciutto, peka bread, and soparnik - local delicacy protected by the geographical origin on the territory of EU. Next stop - seafood specialties in a great restaurant right next to the fish market. You will also taste two types of homemade pasta "makaruni" with a glass of wine (red or white). The tour concludes with a visit to the oldest pastry shop in Split, where you will taste traditional sweets (bobici, mandulat) and homemade gelato. After the tour you will have some time to self explore the old town before returning to your hotel to collect your luggage, meet your private driver and head to the marina where you will board the yacht that will be your home for the next 6 nights.

DAY 3 / Split to Trogir

In the morning, during breakfast, your captain will set sail towards Trogir.

/ Trogir Unesco tour

Trogir is small town, just 1 hour away from Split. Founded by the ancient Greek settlers in the 3rd century BC. For centuries, Trogir was a place where numerous artists left their mark, so we can truly say though it may be a small city, it definitely packs a lot of art and history. Admire the Romanesque and Renaissance architecture, and visit landmarks like the Cathedral of St. Lawrence renowned for its stunning Romanesque door, carved by 13th-century sculptor Radovan, the Loggia, Clock Tower, and Rector's Palace, and then continue toward the waterfront, admiring 11th-century St. Barbara's Church and St. Dominic's Convent. Finally, find out more about the battlements of the Venetian-built Camerlengo Fortress and pause at Marmont's Gloriette, a Napoleonic-era monument, as you wander to nearby St. Mark's Tower.

/ Soccer coach with field

A fun day awaits you today! After lunch the children and their parents will be transferred to the local soccer field where you will meet your professional coach and have proper training. For those who love sports, this is the perfect activity to spend your time and learn the tricks of soccer along the way!

DAY 4 / Trogir to Brac, Hvar

During breakfast, your captain will set sail for Brac Island, the third largest (and the tallest) island in Croatia. Once you dock, you will be met by your guide and 4x4 vehicles to take you to another hidden gem – the Blaca Hermitage.

/ Desert Blaca discovery tour

A once famous Glagolitic desert from the 16th century, later an astronomical observatory, Blaca is situated on the eastern slope of the valley, between Bol and Milna on the southern part of the island of Brac. Blaca is a unique monument on the Croatian coast; it was a hermitage of the Glagolitic Order, an ancient Croatian alphabet. Aside from its historical importance the monastery is set in a stunning place with breathtaking views. This small desert has great monumental value. It started as a stone-walled cave and over time the hermits built single-story buildings for different purposes (kitchens, cellars, furnaces, etc.) In the era of prosperity, luxurious multi-story buildings. In 1588 a small Renaissance church was built, which was expanded during the next century. There are also 3 Baroque altarpieces in the church and paintings from the Venetian school of the 17th century in the desert.

/ Vidova mountain hiking experience

For those that love hiking, instead of the Blaca Hermitage, we have the option to join the hiking adventure to mount Vidova Gora, the highest mountain on the island. The mountain has one of the most beautiful viewpoints of the Adriatic and the area of Knezevrvani, right under Vidova Gora, is populated with black pinewood creating a stunning view. The highest peak of Brac features a 12-meter-high monumental cross made of Brac stone, a telecommunication structure, and a tavern. In the surrounding area, you can see the remains of a double defense wall that where once stood an old Illyrian fortress. This wonderful hiking tour will be ideal for active travelers who love nature and enjoy exploration.

/ Windsurfing lessons (option for teenagers)

This activity is perfect for those who love the sea! Accompanied by your experienced instructor you will learn the secrets of Windsurfing!

/ Art workshop (option for younger children)

During lunch, your captain will start heading towards Hvar Island, where children will love the opportunity to express their creative side during an art workshop. It is a creative escape in a delightful natural setting, and the activities include drawing, painting, mosaics, and t-shirt painting. At the same time, the friendly cats and dogs, along with the expansive gardens, provide additional entertainment. For the group members who are not accompanying the children, we have two optional tours – a guided tour of Hvar town or an afternoon wine tasting.

DAY 5 / Day at leisure

Since you will be docked close to Stari Grad on island Hvar, you have a day at leisure to explore the island or we can provide options closer to the date of your travel for day tours.



DAY 6 / Hvar to Vis

During breakfast, your captain will start heading towards Vis island. Your tours will begin upon arrival to port.

/ Military tour around Vis Island

Today's tour will take you around the whole island of Vis, through the inland and off-road trails to the most hidden Yugoslavian military undermine and a story of the "Forbidden island". Accompanied by your experienced guide you will explore this beautiful island with a long history. Among other things, you will see a marine base undermine for boats and submarines, an underground fuel base, Fort George, and a historical museum inside of the fort. You will also visit the island's biggest military base, underground press and propaganda center, huge tunnel with missile warehouses, tunnels and canons nests of battery base in the cliffs of the south coast, radar base on the Island's top peak, and other locations and surprises of special interest. Then as you continue, this tour will take you through the stories about the "Battle under Issa", British presence on Vis, "Battle under Vis", and historical names from Vis past like Tito, Tegetthoff, Teuta, etc. It's going to become clear to you why the island of Vis was Tito's topsecret fort in the Adriatic Sea. Island Vis has more than 15 military bases and undermines of different lengths and widths of passages.

/ Archery and sword lessons

Enjoy a sword and archery lesson in a fun way. You will be presented with traditional techniques of German fencing schools with "hand" and "hand and half" swords, as well as target shooting with traditional and sports bow.

DAY 7 / Vis to Korčula

During breakfast, you will start heading towards Biševo for your tour of the Blue Cave. Once you arrive, you will be transferred into smaller boats to be able to enter the cave.

/ Visit to the Blue Cave

Set out by small boat toward the island of Biševo to witness one of the Adriatic's most mesmerizing natural wonders. Inside the Blue Cave, sunlight enters through an underwater opening and fills the chamber with an ethereal, silvery-blue glow that feels almost unreal. After taking in the spectacle and a few unforgettable photos, return to your yacht to continue sailing toward the island of Korčula, carrying the memory of one of Croatia's most magical moments at sea.

/ Guided tour of Korčula

Stroll through Korčula's walled Old Town with a local guide and uncover the island's seafaring spirit. Follow the distinctive fishbone layout of its stone streets, designed centuries ago to welcome the sea breeze. Hear stories of merchants, artisans, and explorers, including the legend that Marco Polo was born here. Along the way, admire the elegant facades, lively squares, and sweeping views of the Adriatic. In just two hours, you will see why Korčula is often called the heart of Dalmatian tradition and charm.

/ Sweet workshop in Korčula

Skatula was created out of the desire to open a small, sweet place for the soul, where people will feel warm and comfortable. The shop today produces a range of local products, based on the recipes shared through generations. With more than 20 years of experience the owner of the shop will welcome you and teach you how to prepare traditional cakes of the Dalmatia, with the signature of their famous shop. Once you're done you will try yourself these amazing sweets.

DAY 8 / Korcula to Dubrovnik

Your next sailing destination will be Dubrovnik, and the captain will start heading towards the Pearl of the Adriatic during breakfast.

/ Dubrovnik sea kayaking and Lokrum Island

Explore the unreachable caves and hidden beaches by paddling near impressive sea rocks, and experience the cultural-historical sites from a new perspective. Touch the untouched nature in this unique way and raise your holiday experience to a new level. You will find yourself paddling along the amazing city walls and around the mystical island of Lokrum. As you continue, you will get the chance to enjoy exploring the island of Lokrum with its parks, botanical garden, monastery, and forts.

/ Guided tour of Dubrovnik

(option for group members not joining the kayaking tour)

Step inside the city walls and follow your guide through polished marble streets, lively squares, and quiet lanes. Stroll the Stradun, pause by Onofrio Fountain, and hear vivid stories about the Franciscan Monastery, Rector's Palace, and the Cathedral. Learn how the Republic rose, traded, and defended its freedom. Along the way, get local tips for the best rooftop views, a favorite café, and a calm spot to linger after the tour. A focused two hours that sets you up to enjoy Dubrovnik like a local.

/ Night at leisure

After lunch, you will say goodbye to your yacht crew and meet your driver to transfer to your selected hotel in Dubrovnik.
